

INTERFAITH IN A BOX



- Interfaith Intercultural Cafes In a café like setting, persons of all ages and faiths (teens through seniors) dialogue and learn about each others teachings. We deepen our own awareness and have an opportunity to listen to others.
- •Personal Invitation Invite another faith leader to lunch or dinner. Engage in conversation, set your next meeting date, and discuss how many times you would like to meet one another to participate in interfaith dialogue.
- •Fundraising Events bike-athons and walk-a-thons promote communication while raising funds and having fun. The fundraisers are targeted to raising money for each participating center, as well as the local interfaith community. The suggested split is 50/50.
- •Speaker Bureau: Speaker Bureaus offer the wider community an opportunity to listen to panels and talks by Interfaith Intercultural Speakers. The Interfaith Community also offers a wide range of available speakers when your Senior Minister is away on a Sunday.

INTERFAITH IN A BOX

- Films Have a film night and discussion afterwards.
- •Potluck Dinners— Sponsor an annual potluck dinner featuring foods and tastes from other cultures around the world. Invite Interfaith Intercultural members in your local community to participate.
- •Visiting Places of Worship— Visit and attend services at various churches, mosques, temples and places of worship.
- •Community Service

INTERFAITH IN A BOX





- "64 Ways for 64 Days"— Create Interfaith events and activities around the various peace practices.
- •Sponsor a Peacemakers Series – Create and sponsor a series of talks on great peacemakers free to the public.
- Music Events Create an evening of music with Interfaith artists weaving a theme together.
- Nature Events Sponsor a picnic at a local nature preserve or park.
- •Prayer Ceremony— Create an event where various faith leaders gather in prayer with music from the various traditions woven within a candle lighting ceremony.




Planning an Event that Welcomes All


- Rituals (music, meditations, etc.): Remember that any religious ritual may be off-putting to a first-time
 participant, particularly if it is perceived as exclusionary. (These activities may also be illegal if you are using
 public funding to support the event.) Creating a safe place for all is key.
- Food: Will you be having food at your event? Think and ask about diffeetary guidelines you need to consider for different faiths (Kosher, Halal, Vegan).
- Gender: Are you having both genders work on a project together? Consider the implications of appropriate gender interactions in different religions.
- Cleanliness: Consider purity concerns for any service project. What kind of service work will you be doing?
 Are you asking participants to get dirty or expose themselves to ritually impure products or substances?
- Prayer: What are the prayer needs of the diverse faith communities who will be attending, will you need to set aside time or space for regular prayers (without requiring anyone to participate)?

Inviting Youth, Congregations, and Partners to Join the Day


- Watch for scheduling conflicts! Major religious holidays, school schedules, major sports events can all hurt your attendance.
 - Have all members of the leadership team reach out to others they know and who trust them. Word of mouth will be by far the best strategy for recruitment. More passive strategies rarely work.
- Tailor your invitation to the specific interests and priorities of the group you're approaching. Use stories to inspire particular groups of people based on ideas or issues they are passionate about
- Ask young people to get their own youth groups to participate. Also talk with adult leaders in various faithbased youth programs, and check with other community organizations that may be interested.

O God, you are the source of life and peace.


Praised be your name forever. We know it is you who turns our minds to thoughts of peace. Hear our prayer in this time of crisis.
